

The number of children entrusted for the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter were those accepted in the last quarter of the previous year or in the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of 2015 but travel documents/entry visa were issued only during the 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2015.</p> <p>Disruption of placement may not necessarily be placement of children in current year but in previous years. ICAB envisions that <b>ALL</b> placements will be positive, mutually satisfying to both parties and <b>conclude in the finalization of the adoption.</b></p> <p>Children cleared under the category of Special Needs/Special Home Finding due to being older children 5 years old and above; sibling group of 2-8 sibling group which will require Special Home Recruitment as there are no available approved PAPs in the Roster of Approved Applicants (RAA). Thus these children will not be matched within 10 days from receipt of their dossier.</p>
